About this course

GMDSS (Global Maritime Distress and Safety System)

This course is structured on a combination of theory and practical exercises using both 'live to air' equipment and simulations. It is delivered by fully qualified and accredited lecturers with deck officer or radio officer experience.

This course is for Master and Chief Mates and provides candidates with the skills and knowledge to meet Australian Maritime Safety Authority requirements of Marine Order 70 (Seafarer Certification) 2014, Section 25A.

Please note you must hold the following prerequisites for entry onto this course and evidence must be provided upon first day of class:

- STCW GMDSS Certificate
