The Women in Non-Traditional Trades and Technical Occupations (WiNTT) Scholarship Program is designed to improve women's economic participation and equality in the workforce in traditionally dominated roles such as building and construction, science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM).

The \$5,000 scholarship can be used to cover training costs and other associated expenses to support you in your training journey.

Enrol in one of the selected courses to become eligible to apply. Scan the QR code to search courses.

Applicants will be evaluated based on the quality of their applications, particularly on how well they address the short-written questions.

About the Women in Non-Traditional Trades Scholarships (WiNTT)

The \$2 million initiative supports up to 400 scholarships, each valued at \$5,000 over four years. These scholarships are applicable to women enrolled in eligible apprenticeships, traineeships, or institutional qualifications at WA TAFE colleges and are accessible at all TAFF institutions across Western Australia.

Details:

- Commencing from 1 January 2024
- Up to 20 places available who enrol* in selected qualifications at SM TAFE
- A \$5,000 scholarship for successful applicants
- The payment will cover training costs or other associated expenses to support the participants through their studies.

*Conditions apply. Applicants must have either completed their first block of training or the census date must have passed.

To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must:

- be a person who identifies as a woman;
- · have left school; and
- · be a Western Australian resident and Australian citizen: or
- be a permanent visa holder or holder of an eligible visa sub-class as outlined in the Department's VET Fees and Charges Policy 2024.

You must also:

- be commencing training in an eligible qualification (full-time or part-time) between 1 January and 31 December 2024; and
- be undertaking your course at a Western Australian TAFE college; and
- not be receiving another scholarship for that course of study.
