Dress requirements / PPE

- Protective eye wear
 - o No sunglasses are permitted in the workshop
 - o Safety glasses must be clear and meet Australian Safety Standards
 - Personal eye protection with eye and face protectors are necessary for occupational applications
- Safety steel-capped work boots must be worn at all times
 - Heavy leather uppers and heavy duty soles
 - No sand shoe volley type of footwear allowed (even with steel caps)
- 100% cotton protective workwear clothing including long sleeve shirts and pants

- Scientific calculator (mobile phone not acceptable)
- A4 ruled notebooks (with removable pages)
- 300mm rule
- 2H pencils
- Sharpener
- Eraser
- Pens (blue, black and red)
- USB thumb drive (minimum 8GB)

Licences

- Both the employer and the apprentice have the responsibility to ensure that an electrician's training licence is obtained before the apprentice carries out any electrical work. It is essential for you to attend with your current Training Licence. The guidelines and forms are available from https://www.commerce.wa.gov.au/energysafety/electrical-licensing-forms
- All electrical workers and apprentices must have current first aid and resuscitation skills. Attending a recognised course is recommended annually. It is a requirement that all apprentices attend with a current first aid certificate (minimum HLTAID003 Provide first aid or equivalent)

Tools

It is highly recommended to bring your own insulated (1000V) hand tools e.g. pliers, screwdrivers, wire strippers, and multimeter (minimum CAT III 1000V/ CAT IV 600V).
